The Post was chartered in 1919 by Veterans of World War One. The building and brick walkway were completed by the members in 1939.

The Post has been active for over 100 years supporting veterans, their families, engaging in community activities, helping to develop our youth through athletics and academic programs.

The members of the Post have been the Honor Guard of the Doylestown's Memorial Parade continuously since 1917 except for 2017, when the parade was cancelled.

The Post is a meeting place for VFW, VVA, Marine Corp League, Lions, and veteran's event such as Meghan's Foundation Yoga Classes. It is available to local community organizations and individuals.

As a veteran would you like to be remembered as one who served their country?

Did you have a dad, mother, brother, sister, a relative or friend who served? You can have them remembered with a brick in the Path of Honor. Each year the Post will honor these men and women.

The first section has current and past Veterans. These names represent Veterans of the Revolutionary War, the Mexico War, World War One and Two, Korea, Vietnam, and the Cold War.

The bricks come in two sizes 4"X8" and an 8"X8". The bricks come with a lifetime guarantee and will be replaced at no cost.

The funds from this project will be used to support current and future Veterans events, continue to improve the Post so that local organization and individuals can use the Post.
